BEST.SERMON.EVER. - WEEK 11: Prayer to a Good Dad

The Point: The reason we can pray with such boldness is that God invites us into His presence, just as a good father invites their child in need.

SERMON TEXTS: Matthew 7:7-11

Discussion Questions

(The goal is to grow in our relationship with Christ and each other. It is ok if you don't cover every question.)

DISCOVER

Have someone read Matthew 7:7-86 out loud.


- 1. What do we learn about God from His "ask Me again" command, when it comes the prayers of His children? What do we learn about Jesus as He encourages our honest, confident prayers? (God does not want to be known as a grumpy, harsh Father but as a gracious, caring one. His door is always open to His children and He invites their communication and trust regarding the requests for their needs. Jesus is encouraging our boldness and confidence as we look to God for help. He wants us to feel the same access to the Father as He does.)
- 2. How does this teaching about prayer help us know how God wants us to handle life? Can we be too needy for God? (God wants our dependence, not our independence as we go through life. We are not on our own in this world. We cannot be too needy for Him because He asks us to come with all our desires and troubles.)
- 3. How might we misuse these verses in our prayer life? (The command to ask to receive and seek to find and knock for the door to be opened can be taken and used for selfish gain like in the prosperity gospel. We can take them out of context and try to manipulate God into doing what we want.)
- 4. What was something new you learned from these well-known verses on prayer? (Answers may vary.)

Have someone read Matthew 7:9-11.

- 5. Jesus is assuring us how attentive and trustworthy the Father is in our prayers. Do you approach Him in this way? Do you feel completely at ease (like a son) when you pray, or does it feel impersonal (like a bondservant)? (Answers may vary. Examples of how people may approach God in prayer: boss, judge, santa, scrooge, distant, sky fairy or old man upstairs)
- 6. What are you desperate for, right now? Does persistence and boldness describe how you are praying about it or have you given up? Why or why not? (Try to get your group to open up about their prayer life and how it may need to change. Challenge your group to start praying their big bold prayers, either again, or for the first time.)

ACTION STEP

- 1. What is one thing that stuck out to you in this week's sermon about prayer?
 2. What is prayer? Do you ever feel weird or awkward when you pray? Why?
- 3. Are you living and praying like a "doulos" or a son? What does this mean and how would it change how you pray, when you pray and why you pray?
- 4. What does it mean when we hear that God is a good Father? Why do you think it's easier to pray to God when you know He is a good Father?
- 5. How is something like prayer intimidating? What is an intimidating prayer you are praying or want to start praying? Why?

Parents, one of the most powerful things you can do for your student is to pray over them. You're encouraged to pray specifically for them as you end your time. Pray over their fears, pray over what makes them anxious, pray over what excites them and pray over what intimidates them. There is no secret to the words you pray; posture your heart to pray specifically.
